### **GROUP DISCUSSION**

A Group Discussion (GD) is a selection method used by companies during placements to evaluate multiple candidates simultaneously. It assesses not only knowledge but also communication skills, leadership, teamwork, confidence, and analytical ability. Typically, 6–12 candidates are grouped together and asked to discuss a topic for 10–20 minutes while evaluators observe.

#### **Objectives of Group Discussion:**

Recruiters conduct GD to check:

- Communication and speaking ability
- Confidence and clarity of thought
- Leadership qualities
- Listening skills
- Team behavior
- Problem-solving approach
- Knowledge about the topic

#### **Structure of a GD Round:**

- Topic announcement
- Thinking time (1–2 minutes)
- Discussion starts
- Interaction and arguments
- Conclusion or summary

## **How to Start a Group Discussion?**

A good opening includes:

- Definition of topic
- Importance
- Current context
- Direction for discussion

## **What Evaluators Look for:**

- Quality of content
- Confidence
- Logical thinking
- Leadership or initiative
- Ability to conclude discussion

## **Common Mistakes Students Make:**

- Speaking too much or too little
- Interrupting others
- Lack of knowledge
- Aggressive behaviour
- Repeating same points
- Not listening

## **Tips to Perform Well in GD**

- Speak early (first 3–4 speakers preferred)
- Maintain eye contact with group
- Use facts, examples, data
- Support or counter politely
- Summarize at end if possible
